Every Marriage must be solemnized in the presence of two Witnesses.

Marriage on production of Superintendent Registrar's Certificate.

Married in the St. Nicholas Church, according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church, by or after, by me, WILLIAM GRANFIELD, Curate.

Every Marriage must be registered in duplicate, immediately after the Ceremony: the Parties, the Clergyman, and the Witnesses signing in the presence of each other.

EXAMPLES showing how ERRORS in Registers of Marriages should be corrected by Clergymen of the Church of England.

Errors discovered BEFORE an Entry has been completed.

Errors, whether made by the Clergyman or in any of the Signatures to an Entry, which are discovered before the Entry has been completed and signed by the Clergyman, should be forthwith corrected in the manner shown in the following Example. An error in a Signature should be corrected by the party who made it. All other Errors should be corrected by the Clergyman. The Errors should be numbered by the Clergyman in consecutive order, from the first in the book to the last.

Parties married or the Witnesses to the Marriage attend to witness and sign the original Entry.

The Correction must in every respect be similarly carried out in both Duplicate Registers.

If the Certified Copies including the Corrected Entry have not been made and delivered to the Superintendent Registrar, the Marginal Note must of course appear in the margin of the Copy. But if the Certified Copies have been so delivered, then the Officiating Clergyman must immediately after the Correction, make out on a separate entire sheet of the printed Forms for Certified Copies, a fresh Copy of the Corrected Entry with its Marginal Note, which he must certify and then transmit by post to the Registrar-General.

On the next page will be found Examples of the Form of Marginal Note in which such Corrections should be made.
