

EXAMPLES of Corrections of ERRORS in COMPLETED Marriage Entries.

1. (a) Discrepancy between Col. 2 and the Signature of the Man; and (b) omission of the Condition of the Woman. Corrected by the Successor to the Clergyman who registered the Marriage.

1917. Marriage solemnized at the Parish Church, in the Parish of St. George, Hanover Square, in the County of London.
